Jeff Stout has coached for 39 years at Yucaipa High School in Yucaipa, California. This will be his 40th year as the Head Coach. His overall record of 770-327 which includes 19 League Championships, 35 CIF playoff appearances, and three Southern California State Championships. He has sent over 150 players to play college baseball and has seen 24 players drafted into the professional ranks. More important is his ability to teach life skills helping his players become contributing members of their communities. Stout is an ambassador to the game of baseball being involved with the game at all levels-- Little League, High School advisory committees, State and National teams and committees.

Coach Stout was a recognized baseball player prior to coaching. He was drafted by the Dodgers out of La Puente High School, but chose to play for a year at Mount San Antonio College. He was drafted again and spent six seasons in the Kansas City Royals organization.

Stout contributes to the National High School Association in many ways. He has served on the All American Committee, written articles for BCA publications, and given a number of clinic talks at the National Conventions. Coach Stout attends our conventions regularly. He can be seen sitting up front soaking in as much information as possible to continue his learning. He has helped many assistant coaches learn the fine points of the game being a terrific mentor to them in their careers.
