DURHAM, N.C.—High school baseball playoffs led to upsets aplenty across the country, prompting lots of turnover in the latest Baseball America/National High School Baseball Coaches Association poll.

Ten new schools earned a spot in the poll, led by Lakewood (Calif.) High, which debuted at No. 19 on the strength of its 2-1 victory against Agoura (Calif.) High in the California Interscholastic Federation Division I Southern Section championship game at Angels Stadium. Eight of the nine California schools that were ranked in the May 22 poll lost in the playoffs.

No. 2 Jackson High (Mill Creek, Wash.) backed-up its lofty ranking by completing its season undefeated at 27-0, winning Washington's largest classification championship.

The Woodlands (Texas) High advanced to the Texas Class 5-A state semifinals and was two wins away from clinching a state championship and possibly a final No. 1 ranking.

The staff of Baseball America and the National High School Baseball Coaches Association compiles the Top 50 rankings. In-season polls are conducted every other week, with the final poll released June 19. Records indicated as of June 5 and do not include ties.
