**DURHAM, N.C.—**For the third time in as many polls, the Baseball America/National High School Baseball Coaches Association Top 25 features a new No. 1 team. Agoura (Calif.) High took over in the latest poll on the strength of a 7-0 start, including a 9-0 victory against previous No. 2 El Camino Real High (Woodland Hills, Calif.).

Monsignor Pace High (Opa Locka, Fla.) held the top spot for two weeks, but fell to No. 2 after losing for the first time this season. No. 3 The Woodlands (Texas) High and No. 4 Jesuit High of New Orleans continued their climb in the rankings and No. 5 Bellarmine Prep (San Jose, Calif.), No. 6 Fallbrook (Calif.) High and No. 9 Owasso (Okla.) High pushed into the top 10 for the first time this season.

Jackson High (Mill Creek, Wash.) moved up three spots to No. 7. No. 8 Flanagan High (Pembroke Pines, Fla.) and No. 10 Cypress (Calif.) High held on to top-10 rankings after losing their first games of the season.

The staff of Baseball America and the National High School Baseball Coaches Association determine the Top 25 rankings. In-season polls are conducted every other week, with the final poll released June 12. Records indicated as of March 18 and do not include ties.
