DURHAM, N.C.—The Woodlands (Texas) High headed into the Texas Class 5-A playoffs as the top ranked team in country. The suburban Houston school beat previous No. 6 Brenham (Texas) High 7-2 in its final tune-up before the postseason. The Highlanders had not lost since Mar. 4 and had been ranked No. 1 in the Baseball America/National High School Baseball Coaches Association poll for more than a month.

Nova High (Davie, Fla.) lost twice in a three-week span to open a slot for Jackson High (Mill Creek, Wash.), which moved to No. 2 on the strength of a 3-0 first-round playoff victory against Marysville-Pilchuck (Marysville, Wash.). Jackson senior right-hander Cam Nobles threw a complete game no-hitter to help the Timberwolves improve to 21-0.

No fewer than 14 new teams entered the Top 50, as 40 ranked teams lost at least once since the previous poll.

The staff of Baseball America and the National High School Baseball Coaches Association compiles the Top 50 rankings. In-season polls are conducted every other week, with the final poll released June 12. Records indicated as of May 7 and do not include ties.
